W.J. Aylward taught at the Pennsylvania Institute of Art, the School of Fine and Industrial Arts, Newark, New Jersey and Pratt Institute, Brooklyn, New York while illustrating for magazines such as Scribner's, Harper's, and Collier's. William illustrated and wrote articles on the early days of sailing and illustrated "The Sea-Wolf" by Jack London in 1904 along with many other books. At the age of 43, he volunteered to go to France with the American Expeditionary Force and record their actions in World War I.
